General Information

- Your presentation should be planned to last 15mins.
- After each presentation we will have 5 minutes for questions and answers.
- The questions are expected to come from participants (your class mates). Active participation, both by attendance and asking questions will be given a bonus score.
- You may also make comments (e.g. nice things about the project work, flaws, ...) and these will also be granted bonus scores.

How to structure your presentation

- Start with an introduction in which you provide the context of your project and the motivations for choosing to work on it.
- Next explain what research question you decided to focus on. Why is your question important/useful? Are there similar studies that you have come across? What did you hope to learn from the study?
- Talk about your methodology. Why did you go for one method rather another? Did you conduct a pilot study? (or what other approach did you use to decide on your methodology?)
- What results did you get? (Graphs and Tables are a nice way of capturing this, but screen shots or a demo – if you have these would be great too.)
- What would you do differently?

Participation (Ideas for Questions...)

- What are things you think could have been studied better?
- What are other possible ways this project could have been approached? Would this have affected the results? How?
- Similarities to other projects presented? e.g. similar mistakes, lessons learned ...
- ...
